arch 14 marks one year after you had the choice: to walkout or not. March 14 marks one year since students at Rock Canyon began to learn about their fundamental first amendment rights. A month before this anniversary, Denver Public School teachers walked out over their pay. A student from East High School recorded and photographed the strike around his school, after the larger media was barred from the school. The student was given a choice from the administration: stop filming inside the school or leave.

Colorado, luckily, has more student free expression rights than most other states. The rule generally for Colorado high school is that free speech is accepted in schools if it isn't: libelous, slanderous, defamatory, or disruptive to the school day. To simplify those rules; your speech cannot destroy a person's reputation, or spread falsities about others. The main factor in student free speech is that it does not significantly disrupt the school day. In Rock Canyon, we are fortunate enough to have an administration that protects to student free speech, especially with the walkout March 14, 2018.
