What's what?

The inside scoop on Homeroom and Access

You will have the same teacher for Homeroom and Access. The classes are credited based on attendance, productivity, and character. Students of all grades will be required to attend both classes. No one will have off campus privileges during these times. Students who skip either class will be marked absent.

What is Homeroom?

A time to do team building activities and social emotional learning, in addition to watching EVT and attending class meetings and assemblies.

Why are we doing this?

We're building a strong school culture!

What is Access?

A time to get the support you need. You can use Access to make up work, talk to teachers, do homework, or collaborate with other students on group projects anywhere on the school campus.

Why are we doing this?

Every student should be able to access every teacher during a common time, and with Access, that is possible.

Wait, so, how does it work?

You'll be in Homeroom and Access classes with students from each grade, some of whom you've never met!

Wait, so, how does it work?

You'll check in for attendance with your Access teacher, and there will be a pass system for you to go use Access the way you need to. You'll have to check back in at the end of Access with your teacher, or else you will be marked absent.

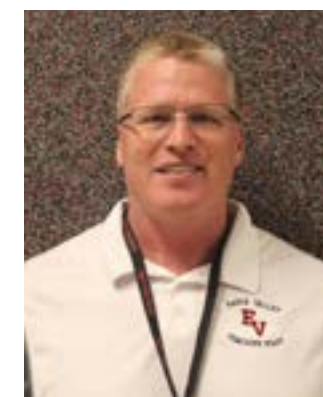

FEATURES OF NEW BUILDING

Collaborative Spaces



The new collaborative spaces are an exciting new aspect of the Eagle Valley campus. Complete with couches, whiteboards, tables, and outlets, these new spaces cater to students and teachers looking for places to work. Outside of many classrooms, these spaces offer a way for classes to easily work together throughout the year and a collaborative space for students with off-hours to work.

The Courtyard



Students have a new route available from building to building - straight through the courtyard! This new outdoor space is also amazing space for students to sit, relax and enjoy the sun. It has ample sitting space including adirondack chairs and stone benches, cornhole games and beautiful landscaping. The main pathway is heated to avoid snow buildup during winter months, so students won't have to worry about soaking their shoes in snow while walking to and from class.

H2 Building



H2 is the Health Sciences building. It is home to classes like Honors Anatomy and Physiology and DE College Algebra. This new building boasts a 60-seat lecture hall, which also doubles as a dance studio, classes for the new Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) program, and a professional grade student kitchen, designed to be educational and functional. It is an incredible new asset to our school and will be in a buzz of activity all year long.

NEW PROGRAMS

Culinary

Because of support from Colorado Mountain College, the new H2 Building is home to a new facility for the culinary students. The program now has both a commercial kitchen and a residential kitchen, which offers lots of space and resources to expand the program offerings. "We hope to add a catering course within the next couple years," says Mr. Doan. The catering course would allow students to gain more knowledge about the culinary career path before graduating high school.

Biomedical Sciences

Project Lead The Way's Principles of Biomedical Sciences is a class geared toward freshmen. It is the first in a series of new biomedical courses that will be offered at Eagle Valley over the next few years. To complement this program, one of the new rooms in the H2 building was created entirely for the purpose of teaching students how to care for patients and learn other medical practices. Similar to the culinary program, there are still more changes in the works for this program. Mr. Doan says, "hopefully there will be a Certified Nursing Program (CNA) that will come to Eagle Valley within the next few years." The CNA program would be an open to students interested in exploring careers in the medical field during high school.

Create a schedule for yourself so that you know what you need to do when. Include the time you will spend on any activities in your schedule. This way, you will know how much time you have for school.

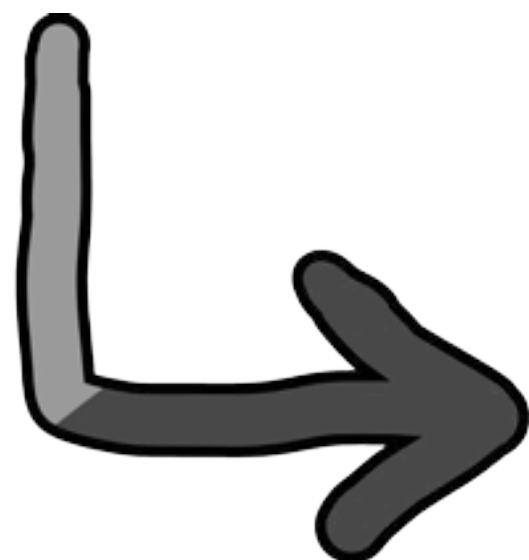
3 Use school supplies that work for you

It can be near impossible to remember all the assignments, quizzes, and tests that pop up weekly. By writing them down, you are more likely to get them done well.

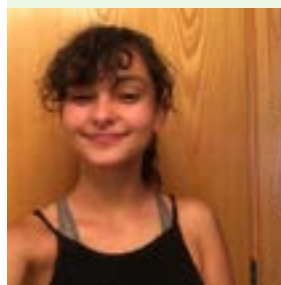
5 Take time to recharge

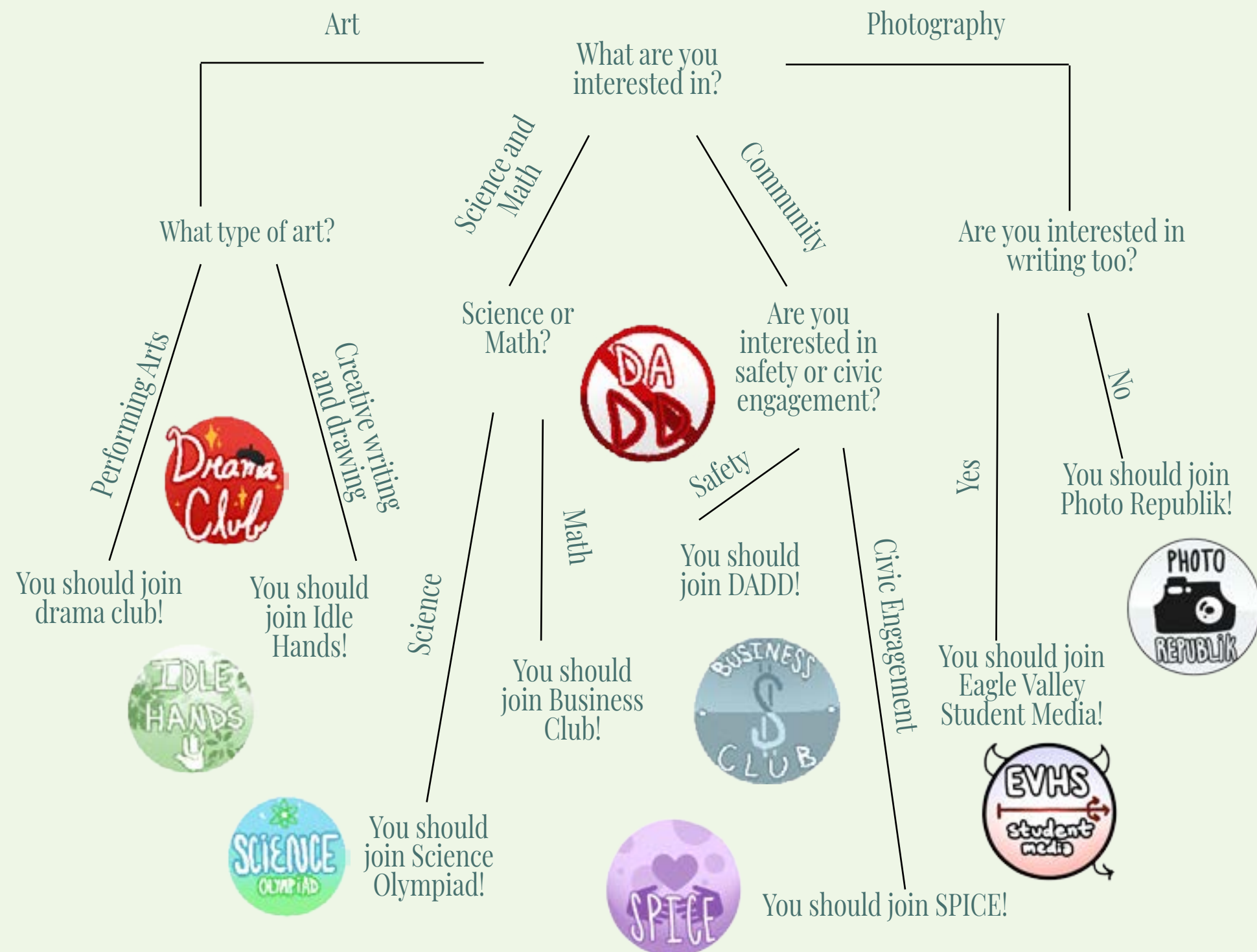

Members learn about photography, how to use the school's camera equipment, and careers in the photography/graphic design industry.

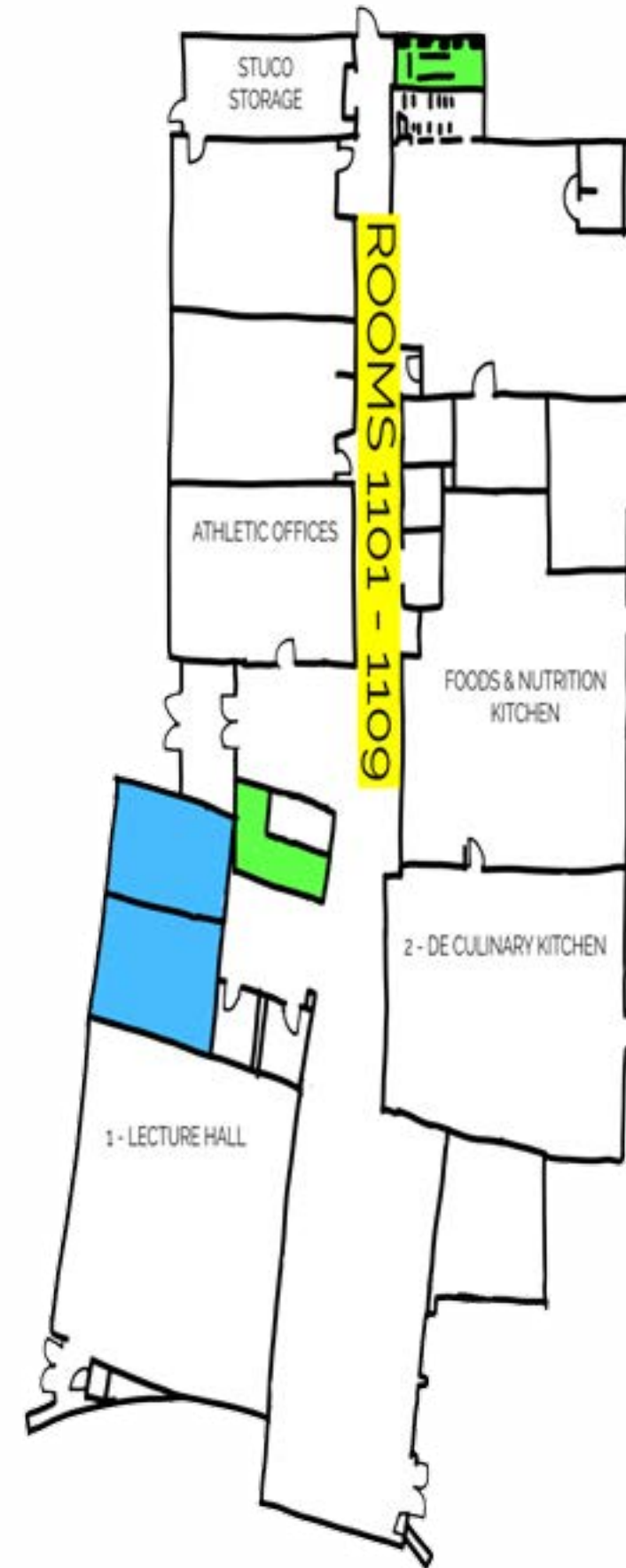
Students Promoting Inclusion & Civic Engagement (SPICE)

Idle Hands is the literary arts magazine created by EVHS Students. Students participate as members of the Editorial Board or by submitting their creative works.

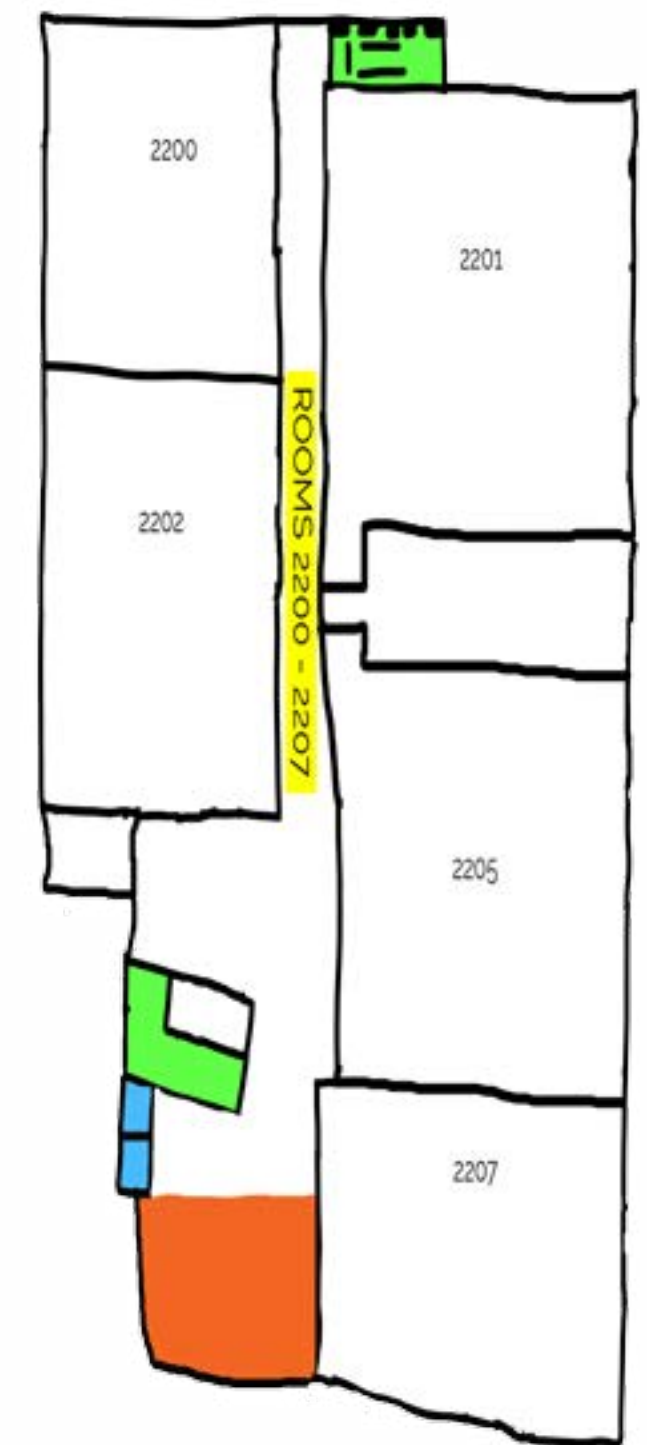
Yearbook

1| Lecture Hall

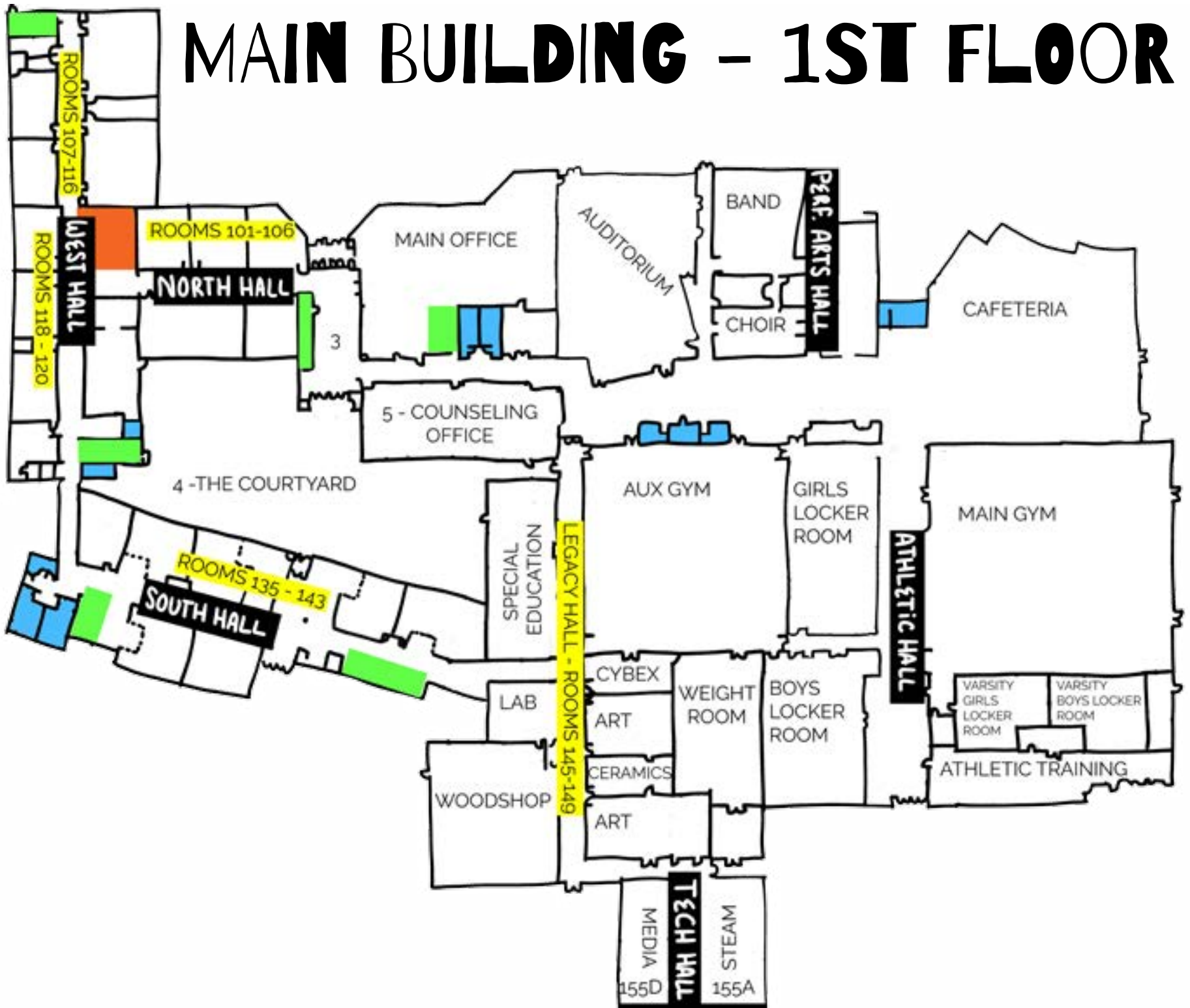

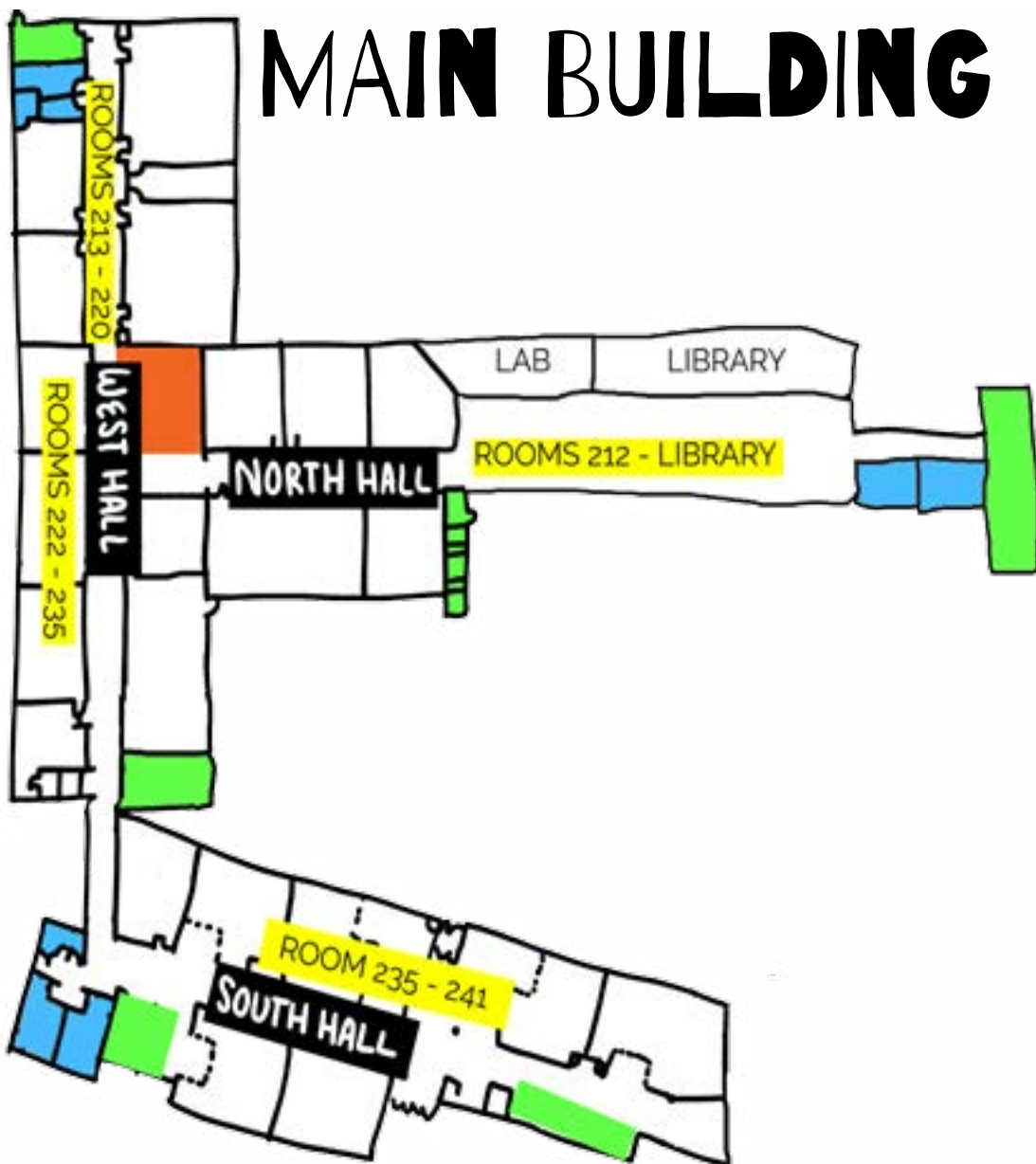
SCHOOL MAP

3 | The Eagle

The eagle is a central hub of Eagle Valley. Many people meet up at the eagle between classes or after school before going to activities together. It is located at the North Entrance of the campus.

4 | The Courtyard

The courtyard is one of 10 new hangout spots in Eagle Valley. It contains adirondack chairs, stone seating, cornhole games, and beautiful botany. As well, it is an access point between two buildings to make travelling to classes much quicker.

5 | Counseling Office

The counseling space has undergone many changes over the summer. It is now separated into three sections: College and Career Readiness, Personal Counseling, and Academic Counseling.
