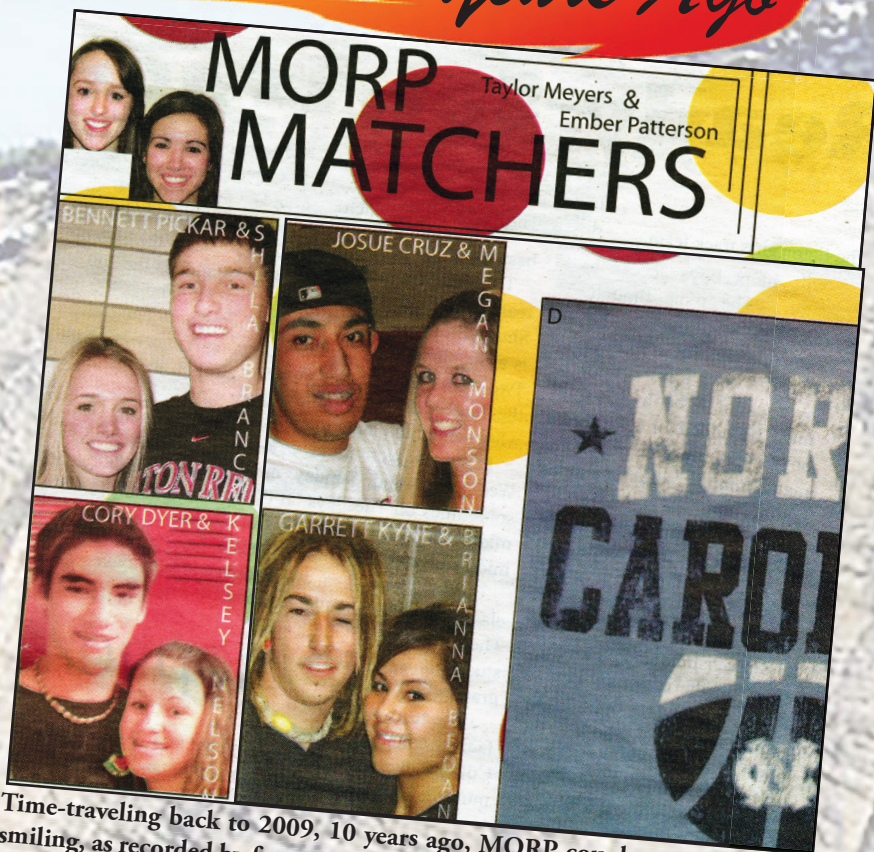

I'm going. I have a date and I'm happy.

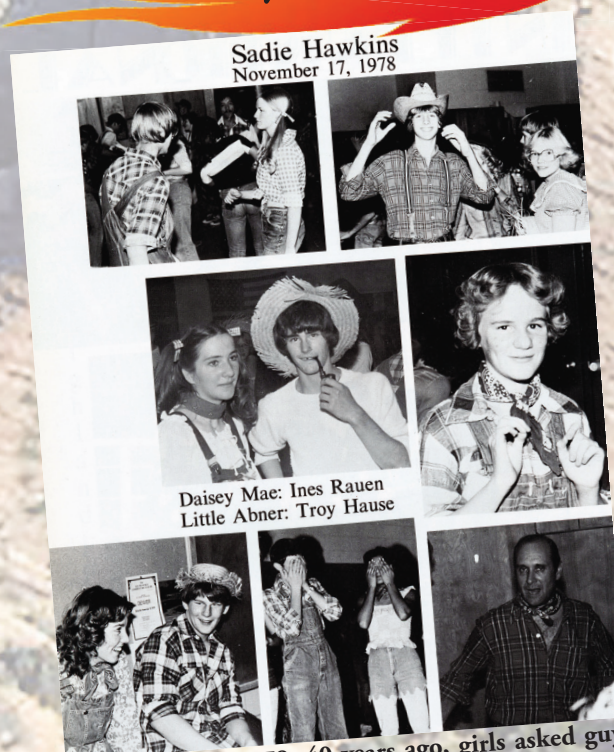


Tiffany Jay, Senior
