
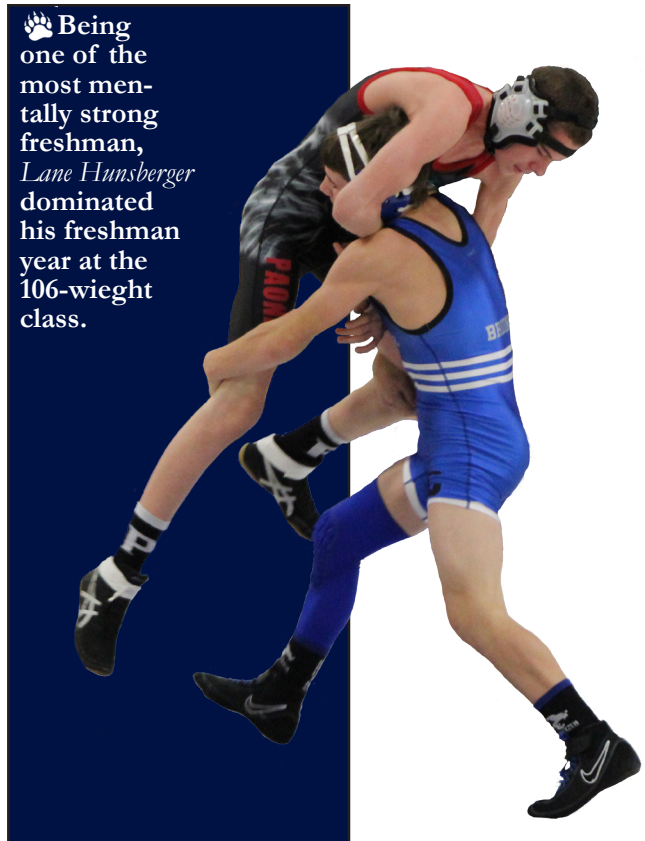



# Revealing Wrestling Domination

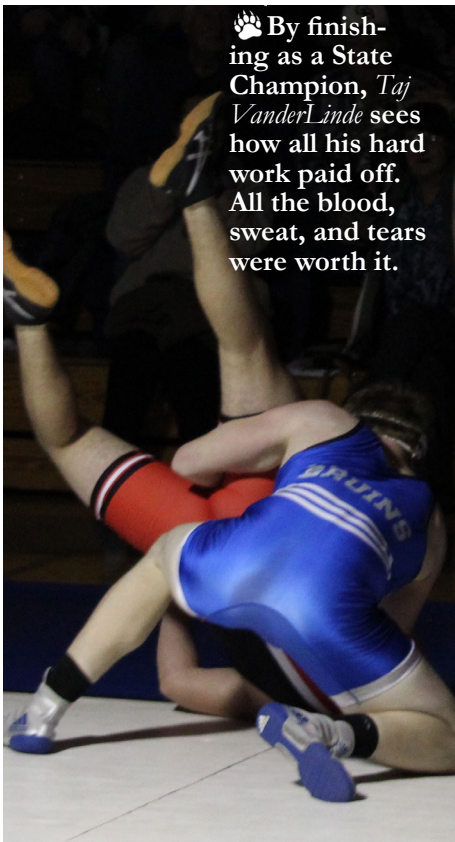
 Derek Sanchez sizes up his opponent at Palisades Bulldog home duel. To start off the year, Derek pinned his challenger with in only a few minutes of the match.
