Our Cresthill students at the Valentine's Day party participate in dancing the Macarena together.



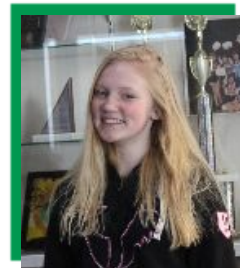

2. How About Another One?

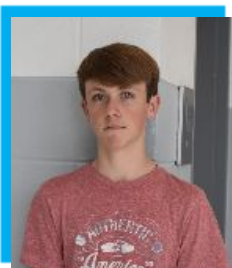
Our WEB students host a pancake breakfast for the Veterans from present and past that protect our country.

NJHS prepares to take action to make the CMS community a better place for everyone.



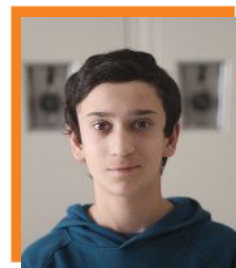
