

## Rules and REGULATIONS

Judges rules for senior students to participate in Senior Assassination

At the start of each week (Sunday Nights), each team was randomly assigned a different team to eliminate by noon the following Sunday. This was not the same team that may have been attacking them.

All players must have worn a floatie outside of school to be safe from getting eliminated. The floatie had to be attached to an individual's body in order for it to be considered safe.

All players had to be in groups of two or solo to participate.

A team was eliminated when both players on that team had been soaked by water blasters, water balloons or a hose.

Eliminations had to be filmed on camera to count as an elimination and sent to the judge and receive validation by the video being posted. If an elimination was not filmed, then it would not be counted and a group's target remained in the game.

School is the only safe zone.

On purge days, floaties were useless and did not provide immunity. Every Wednesday was a purge day. All other rules applied on purge days.

"I didn't think that the game was going to be so intense, but Brenlyn and I had

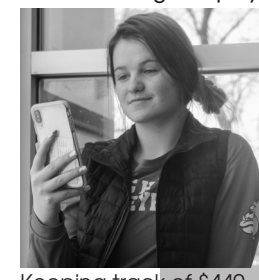
