
THE ELEMENT OF SURPRISE...



The setting of the novel takes place in the southeastern part of Nigeria upon the arrival of Europeans during the 19th Century. The main protagonist in the book is Okonkwo, who represents the worst and best qualities in a tribal leader. Okonkwo is constantly having to reassure himself of being successful due to his father, Unoka's constant failure of being responsible and leaving behind a large debt onto Okonkwo's shoulders. This was a large stepping stone Okonkwo had to conquer and had to learn how to determine his own success.
