For the first deadline, the story must have five paragraphs written, the story must be written in the correct font and font size, and general proofreading must be made.

For the second deadline, at least half of the story must be written. Grading is a lot stricter on deadline two. There can be bastards in the story, the byline must be placed, and the story cannot be bumping. A bastard is when there is a single fragment of a sentence at the beginning or end of a column and a new paragraph starts immediately after. Bumping is when a picture or column is interfering with a headline, margin, or other separate piece of the page.
