



"I wish I could have hung out with more of my friends" Stroup said, "last year our group was bigger and we weren't restricted by Covid," Kriss added.


Halloween has always been a big hangout and party holiday, but due to Covid, groups had to be restricted and lowered, yet there were still silver linings for Halloween 2020.

Dear Future Self...






