"The best part of the live stream was being warm inside and with my friends while watching the game. It gave me an opportunity have more social interactions," Caley Harper '21 said.

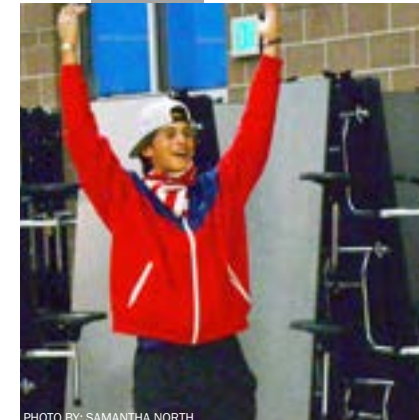

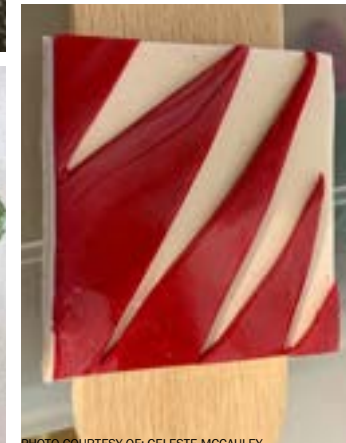
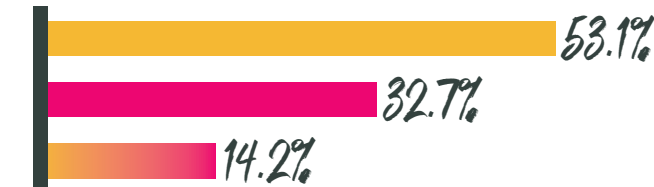
