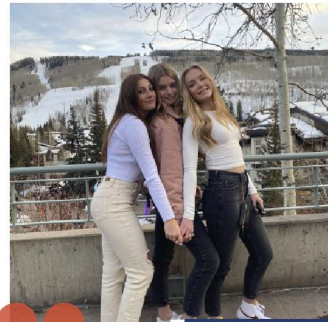

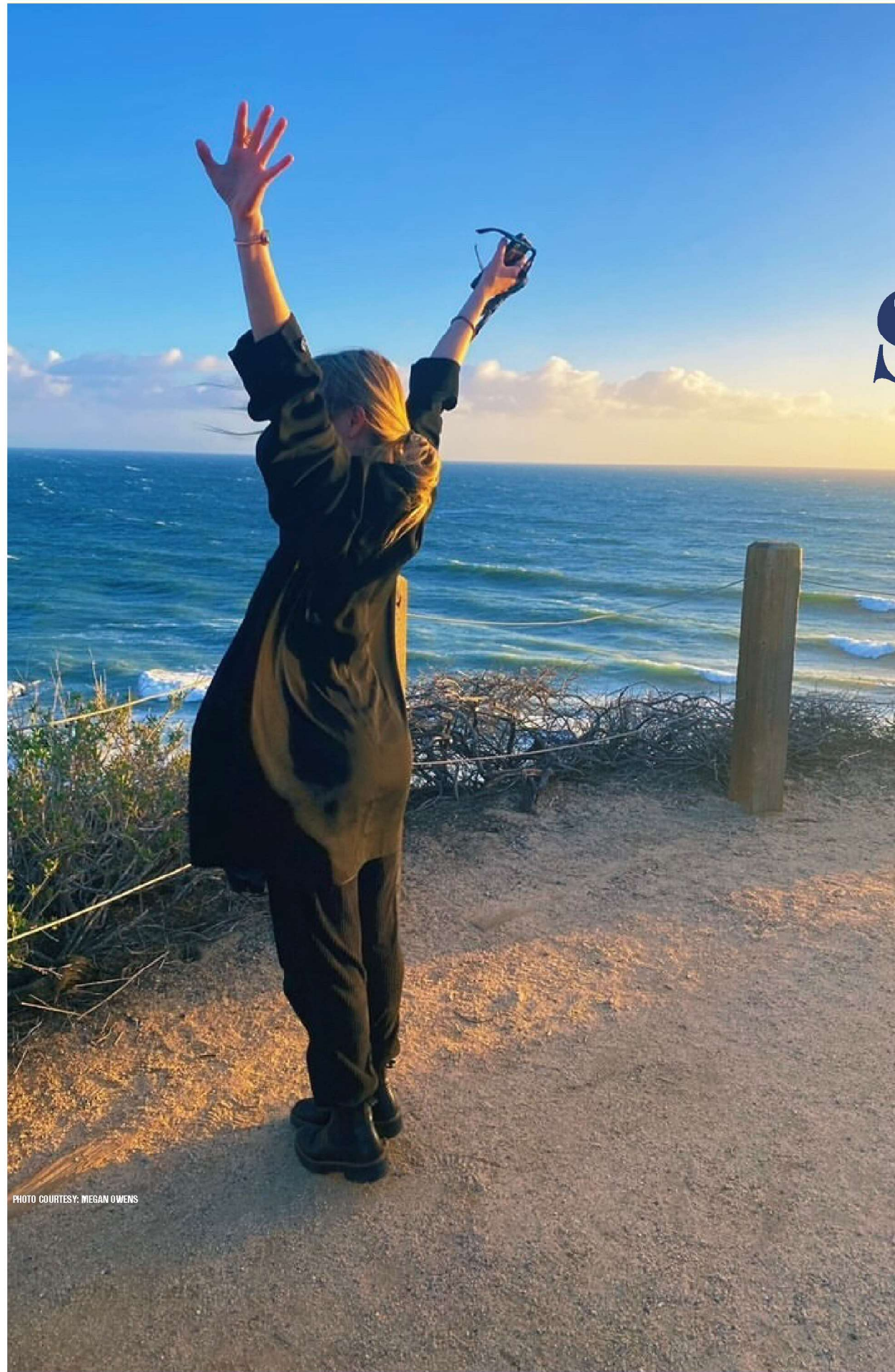

Her grandparents loved the ocean and would bring the whole family there throughout the years. Once they both moved on from this life, Owens knew that there was still a connection.

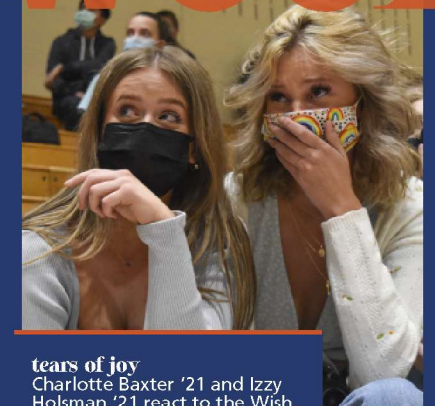
