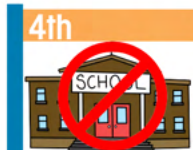
Cancellations, alternate plans, and different schedules...here is the recap

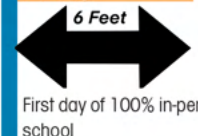
