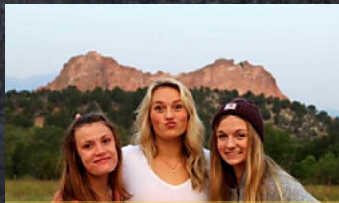

SENIOR SUNRISE



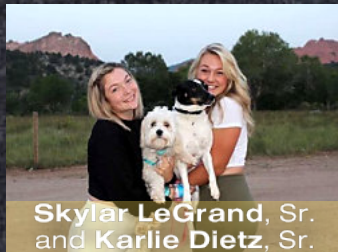
