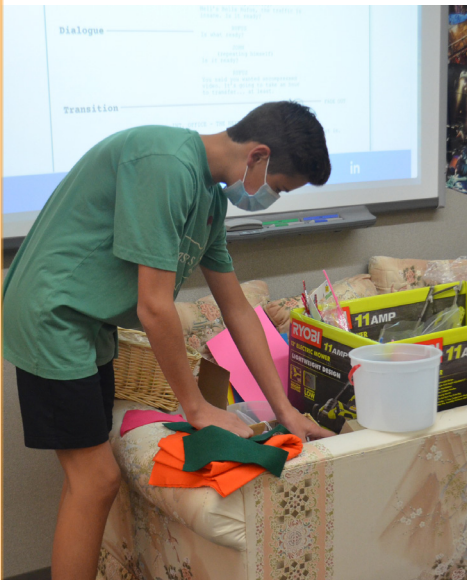


## Students Finish up their Detail on the Sock Puppets
