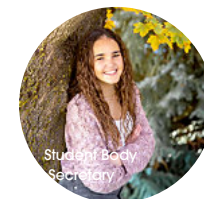
The student council is hoping the rest of the school is just as excited about the dance as they are, and by the looks of it, the students are even more excited about it than the whole student council combined.

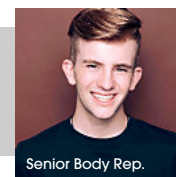
"Now that I am a senior, I am now the person planning stuff and running all the meetings, which is fun." -Raelee McCurdy '22

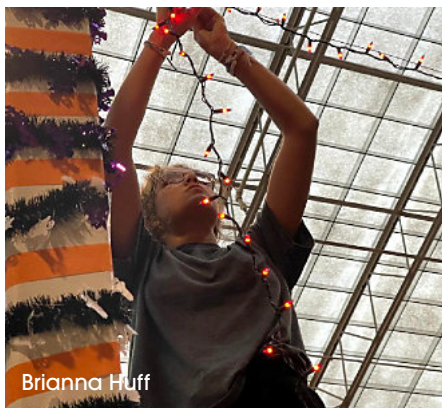


"The talent show this year was my favorite event. The school was very enthusiastic about it and I feel like it brought us together as a community." -Emma Wise '22

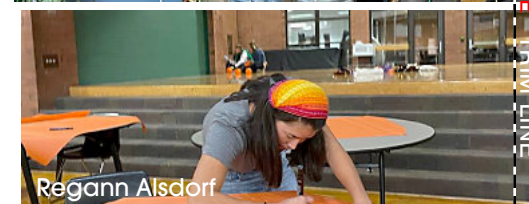
