# ROBOTICS



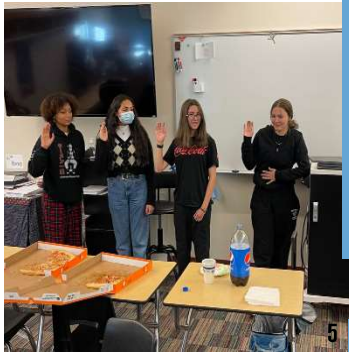

# JOI CLUB

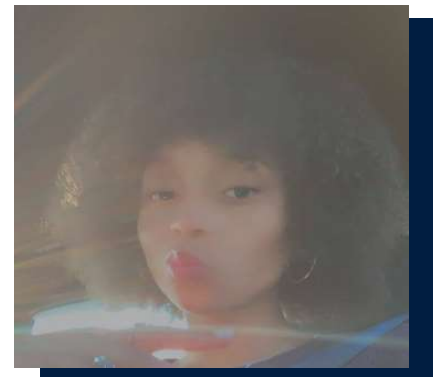
