

1. Beneficial

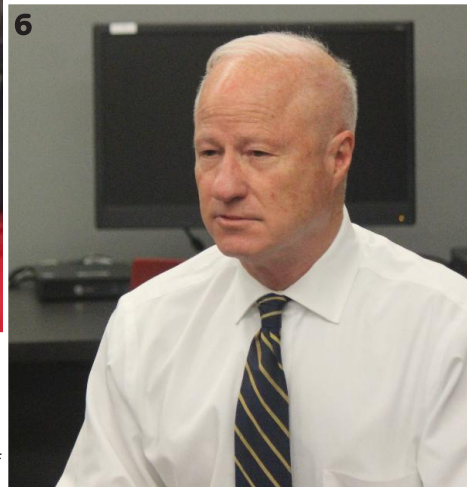

Beyond the Future

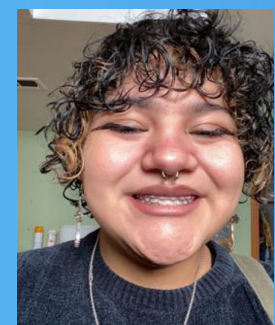
Joined by FBLA, Raiders work and learn from one another on their paths to lead the future.
