## ART STUDENTS CAPTURE THEIR ARTISITC SENSE WITH PAINTING

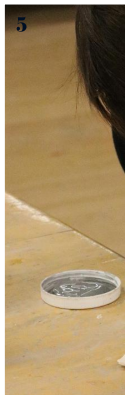

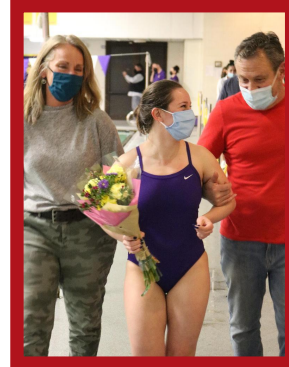
