Rose Weidemann '22 becomes next Adams County Fair Lady-in-Waiting on Oct.24

SINCE SHE WAS A LITTLE GIRL, ROSE WEIDEMANN '22 HAS HAD HER SIGHTS SET ON THE ADAMS COUNTY FAIR ROYALTY after

she watched previous Rodeo Queens during fairs and rodeos.

"I would always attend rodeos and fairs and be in complete awe over seeing Rodeo Queens present the American flag and events," Weidemann said. "I always wanted to be able to represent and follow in these ladies' boots."

During the Lady-in-Waiting pageant on Oct. 24, 2021 at the Adams County Fairgrounds, Weidemann competed against other girls in the county. On the day of the pageant, she had to show judges how to put a saddle on a horse,

"Through the horsemanship interview you are greeted by the judges who are going to ask you questions as you are grooming and saddling the horse," Weidemann said.

"Horsemanship is an incredible part of the pageant. There are three standard patterns and the judges will pick one of those patterns to compete on."

The pageant, while an essential part of the preliminary process to be crowned, provided many anxieties about being in the limelight in front of the judges.

"I was a little nervous about this. Always stay calm and breathe. Horses pick up on every little feeling. The more relaxed you remain, the more they'll respond to you and your commands," Weidemann said. "The littlest mistake will feel huge to you, but know that the audience and the judges probably never noticed." After all of the preliminary rounds. Weidemann went

on stage to be crowned the Adams County Lady-in-Waiting. "After the pageant and going through the interviews, I received the smaller Adams County crown which will be with me until coronation on March 5 where I will receive the official Adams County Ladyin-Waiting crown and chaps," Weidemann said.

The process to receive this title was not short of hard work and determination. Weidemann attributed most of her success to two organizations.

"Events that lead up to this opportunity would be FFA and 4-H." Weidemann said. "Without the foundation of these youth leadership organizations, I would not be in the position I am today as Ladyin-Waiting."

According to Weidemann, the Adams County Fair Queen and Lady-in-Waiting are valuable positions to the Fair not only in, but also out of the arena. The positions come with various duties to perform. Becoming the Adams County Lady-in-Waiting

was a huge accomplishment for Weidemann and she recalls the joyous feelings afterward.

"Your jobs are to be available to serve in many capacities including utilizing horsemanship skills and public speaking," Weidemann said. "This is the start of a whole new chapter in my life and I will be given many opportunities representing the western way of life, empowering young women in agriculture."
