As the concluding notes from "Waltz of the Sugar Plum Fairy" faded from the piano, Annie Benson '22 stepped forward to the microphone during the Winter Choir Concert at St.Andrew United Methodist Church on Dec. 7. With the bright lights beaming down, Benson began her speech in hopes of starting change for a teacher in need. While most attendees of the concert were there to enjoy the music, this event took a deeper meaning for the singers to be able to raise the essential funds for someone who desperately needed it.

"At first I was a little nervous, but mostly excited," Benson said. "Even with my initial nerves, I was really passionate about my mission

for the night and the goal of the choir program." English teacher, Colleen Lamb received diagnosis of Stage 2 Breast Cancer early in the sememster. In order to stop the progression of her disease, she was forced to undergo a double mastectomy in late December. Patients typically pay approximately anywhere from \$15,000 to \$50,000 per mastectomy; Lamb faced the cost in double. In hopes of alleviating some of the financial stress, Choir dedicated all of the proceeds from their Winter Concert to her surgery.

"I'm really proud of the choir program for doing the fundraiser for Ms. Lamb and I'm really proud to be part of a community that cares so much about our teachers," Benson said. "Thanks to all the donations, we were able to raise a lot of money for her surgery which was amazing. Ms. Lamb cares so much for everyone, so I'm really grateful that we could show her how much she means to our school and how much we care about her!"

"She has been one of my favorite teachers and such a positive influence on my school year, so I was so happy we could honor her that night and it was a really special experience for me to speak," Benson said.
