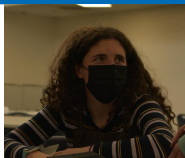

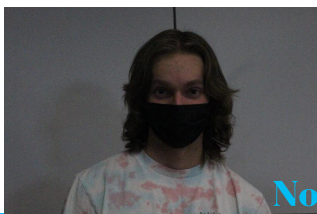
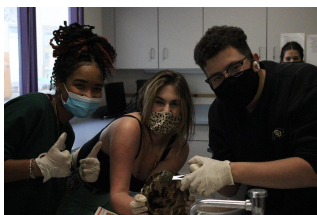
"I prefer hard shell tacos because I'm scared of having to fold the soft ones. Everything falls out and it's too complicated."
