Dia de los Muertos

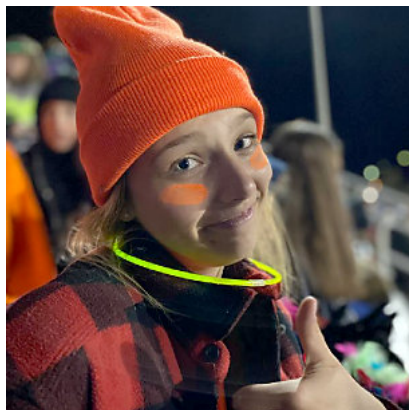
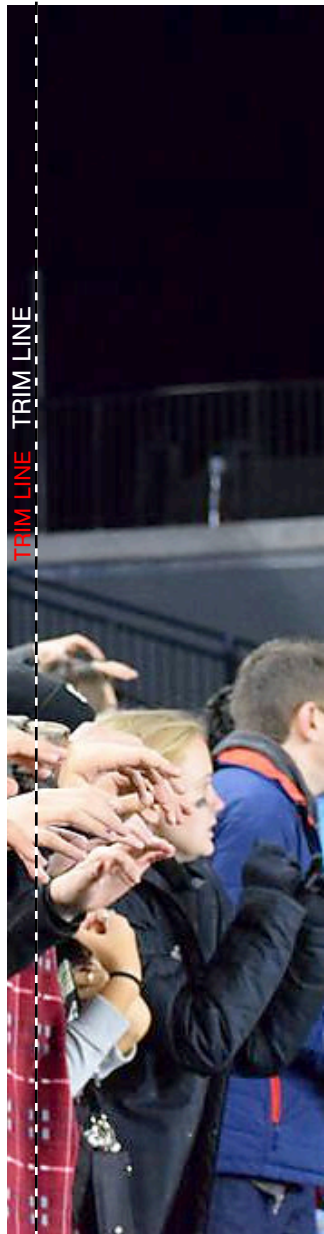
