reek's football team won their fourth state championship in a row, beating Valor Christian High School 24-17. It's Creek's 13th all-time, and Coach Dave Logan's fifth at Creek. This is the only four-peat in 5A Colorado football history.

Emotions ran high during the game, according to senior running back Carlson "Bubba" Tann. "To be able to go out there and be down by four in the first half and keep the momentum up: we were all just really happy and excited that we were able to complete the journey," he said over text interview.
