

VISTA Volume 15 was produced by the Ridgeline staff at Vista Ridge High school in Colorado Springs, CO and was printed by Jostens in Kansas City, KS. The account was serviced by Kati Knisley and Michelle Gainey. Andrea Adams was the Ridgeline Adviser. There were 20 students on staff for the 22-23 school year. The cover was designed by the Ridgeline Editing Staff and incorporated a custom litho with UV coating on high gloss. An important design element for this book,

was the Vogue Magazine style. The 2023 volume has 216 full color printed pages with supplement. All body is set in News Gothic Book 12 point font, captions and photo numbers were in News Gothic Book 10 point font, names were written in News Gothic Bold. Headlines were written in Bodani Semi Bold in all capital letters 48 point font as minimum. Layouts were designed on Adobe InDesign and submitted via Jostens Monarch software.
