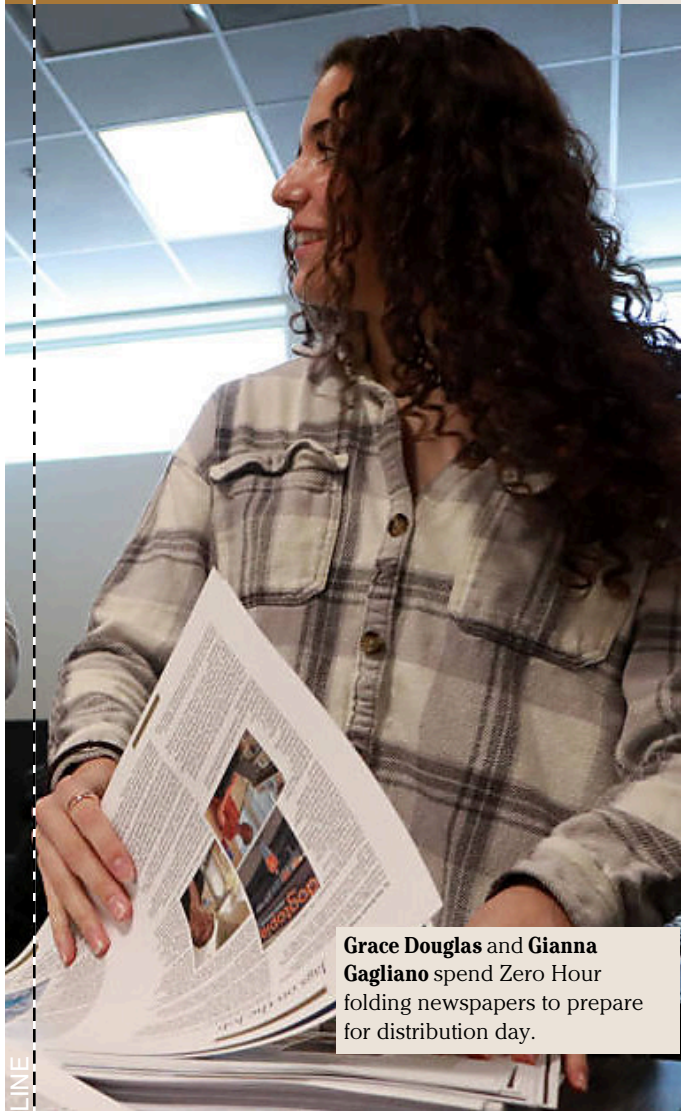


program perfection
