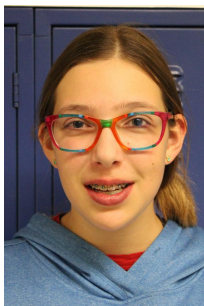




## BATTLE OF THE BOOKS
