QUOIA



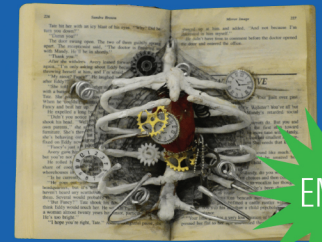
"I used watercolor and sharpies and my inspiration was playing D&D with my friends and there were fairies," **Quoia Salva (10)** said.

CORA R.



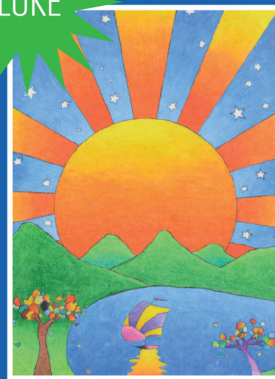
"I found inspiration for this piece when I went skiing. If I could do this again I would make the layers a little clearer," **Cora Reinholt (9)** said.

BROOKLYN



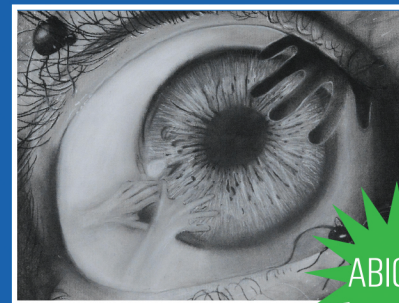

ABIGAIL



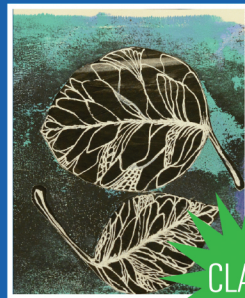
"I used charcoal for this piece and it's mainly just about combining images," **Abigail Diaz (10)** said.

CLARA



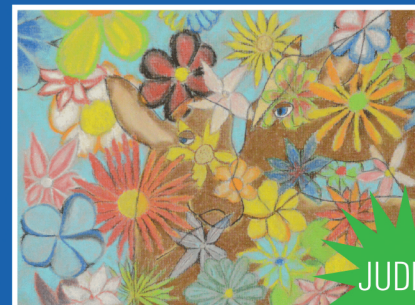
