
"I have had a few students get caught for using AI and the result is the same. They are not learning the material," Mrs. Sara Cady said.

Students can give AI such as Open AI or Chat GPT, a command to write an essay or do an assignment and receive the results with seconds.


"For certain classes like English and such you can use AI. I do use it to help me generate some writing ideas and useful tips and formatting advice," Scarlett Beerbower '24 said.
