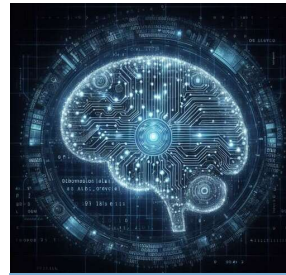


Human or Bot?

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is the simulation of human intelligence by machines that can be used to carry out tedious tasks in a faster manner than humans. The use of AI has generated plenty of controversy in multiple fields, especially in education. When asked about his view on the subject, Henry Lyman ('26) said, "[AI] has the capability to solve complex problems, enhance efficiency, and contribute to scientific and technological advancements. However, there are also concerns and ethical considerations surrounding AI including: issues related to job displacement, bias in algorithms, privacy, and the potential for misuse. Striking a balance between harnessing the benefits of AI and addressing these challenges is crucial for the responsible development and deployment of artificial intelligence technologies."

ADAPTING AND INTEGRATING

With the capabilities of Artificial Intelligence improving at a rapid pace, many teachers have been exploring this groundbreaking technology. Teacher Jeffrey Boyce said, "I think that we should all learn how to use AI in a responsible and appropriate manner. It is a powerful tool and it is not going away. Students should learn how and when to utilize this tool. We should foster conversations about the instances when AI is and is not appropriate. I feel like we as a species are becoming more dependent on the technology that we develop and I wonder if it will lead to a decrease in creativity, problem solving skills and resilience. AI has created many ethical controversies surrounding its use across different applications, such as education, digital art, job displacement, data privacy, and credibility. While many people see AI as a useful tool, many people exploit it to plagiarize work instead of doing it on their own. When asked about his views on the subject, Ian Gar ('24) said, "I think the useful and interesting applications [of AI] are in scientific research because AI can provide new procedures for certain experiments and such. This provides useful knowledge that isn't directly contributing to the crowding out of human workers like when AI makes art. But, AI being used to take the jobs of already broke artists doesn't make much sense to me."

AI APPLICATIONS

With many new applications launching their own AI technology, students have found new ways to apply AI to school and their everyday lives.
