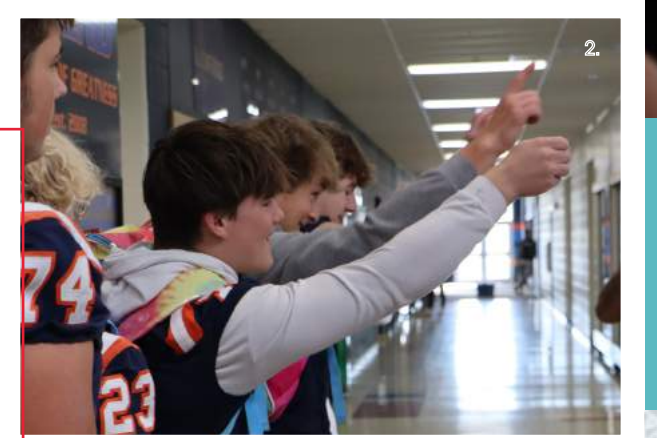

"I feel like the clap out hyped us up and got us ready. It was cool to see the school come around us and it was fun," senior Nate Sandy said.

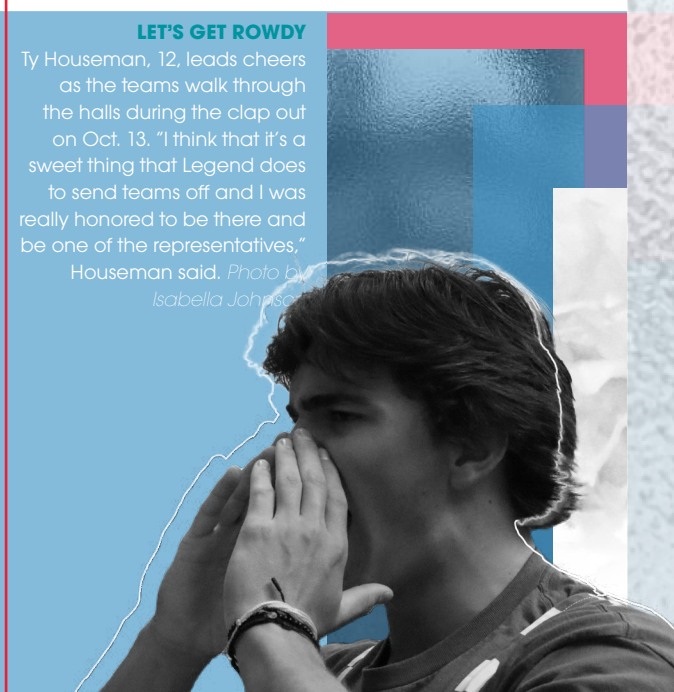
Having their game broadcasted on the news was a very special experience for the team, giving them exposure and a crowd to play for.
