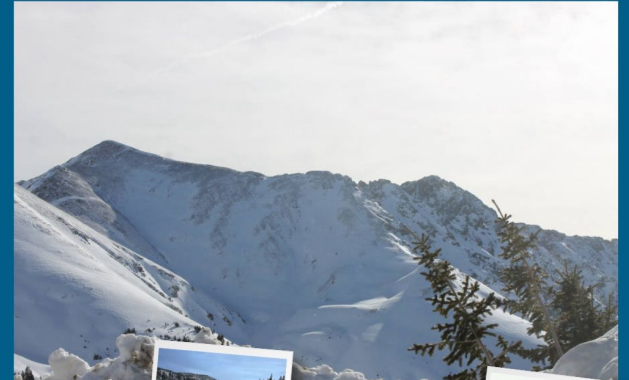


Racing Down

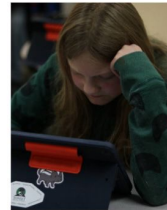

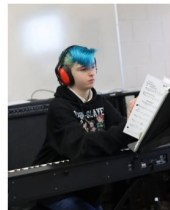
