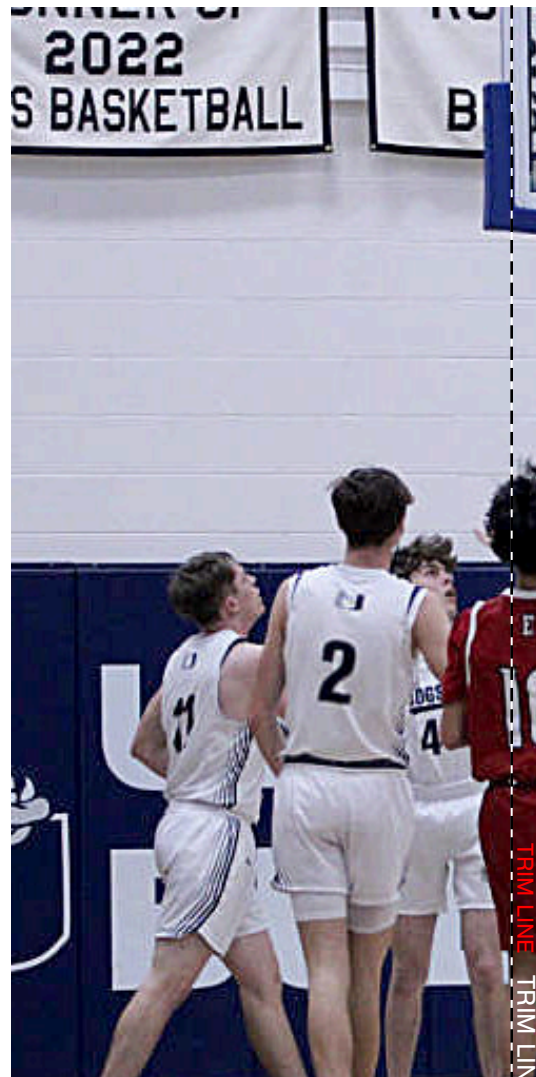

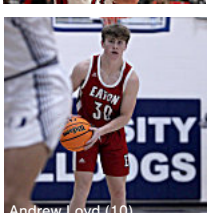

Stepping out on his own, was first year head coach Tanner Ervin to face off against University Bulldogs head coach, Bobby Ervin, who just happens to be his father. Tanner Ervin went to high school and played basketball for Resurrection Christian and then went on to play at CSU- Pueblo in college. Growing up in a basketball household has made the decision to play and coach basketball a breeze. After one year at CSU-P he returned to coach under his father for four years at University. Ervin has always wanted to be the head coach of his own program, so when the opportunity came up in Eaton he took it. "When the job became available, it was a no brainer to put my name in. Thankfully I was given the opportunity to coach and teach in this community and I have loved every second of it since I have been here," said Ervin. On January 23rd, the Bulldogs arrived in Eaton for the first rival game of the season. During a close back and forth game, Eaton's post, Senior Mitch Haythorn scored 18 points and had 7 rebounds, which put him one step closer to eventually hitting the 1,000 point mark later on in the season. Eaton held their own and won 57-43. Eaton faced off against the Bulldogs again on February 13th on Bulldog turf. The Reds fought the good fight, with the score staying within 2 points most of the game. Within the last 3 minutes Eaton pulled ahead and won the second rival game of the season. Eaton beat the Bulldogs for the second time, 64-46. A good coach is confident in a team he built and Coach Ervin is confident in his game plan and most importantly in his team. When asked if he was going to be making any adjustments to their game plan for game #2 against the Bulldogs, Ervin said, "Well-coached teams make adjustments after losses, so we will have to be ready for anything that they decide to throw at us." Eaton made it to the 1st round of playoffs, but sadly came up two points short against Fort Lupton, 65-67. Reds finished their season 13-10.

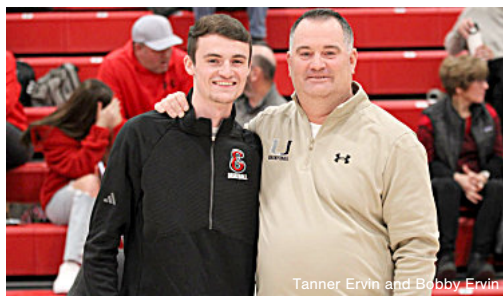
