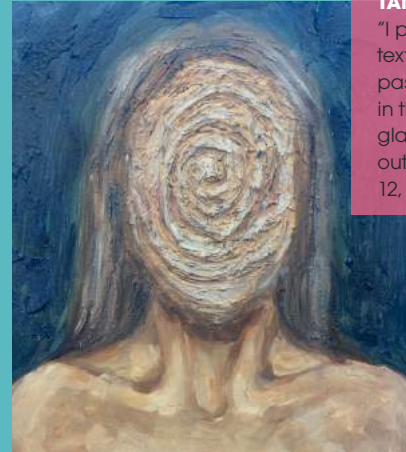


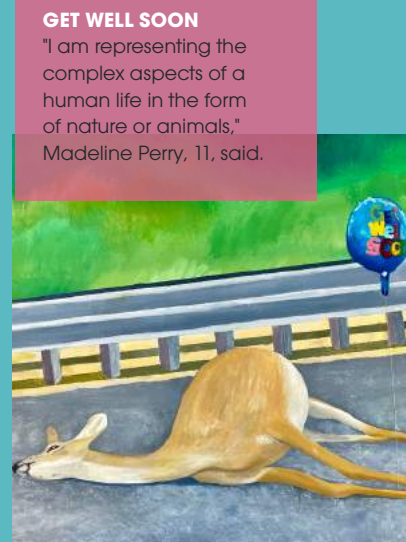

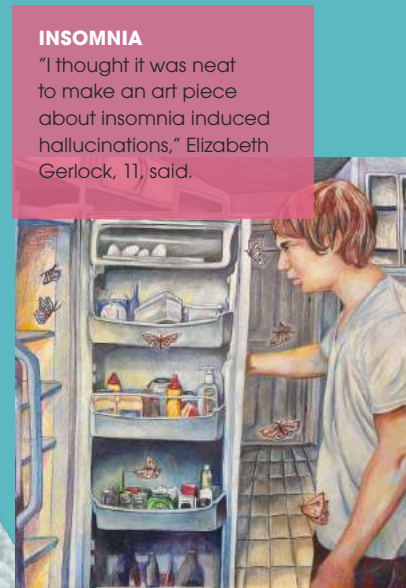

"I am trying to connect the deepest parts of ourselves back into nature through metaphorical imagery," Madeline Perry, 12, said.



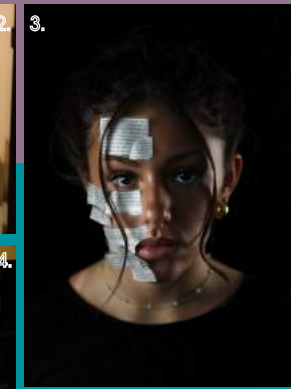
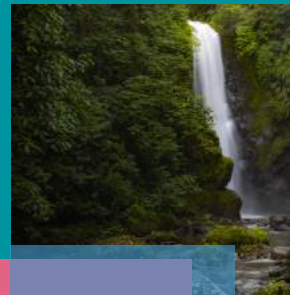
INCUBATE
