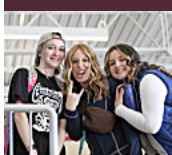

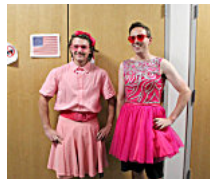

Kayle Mackey (11) and teacher Alexander Adams wear pink dresses to represent Barbie and brought laughter to all of EHS.

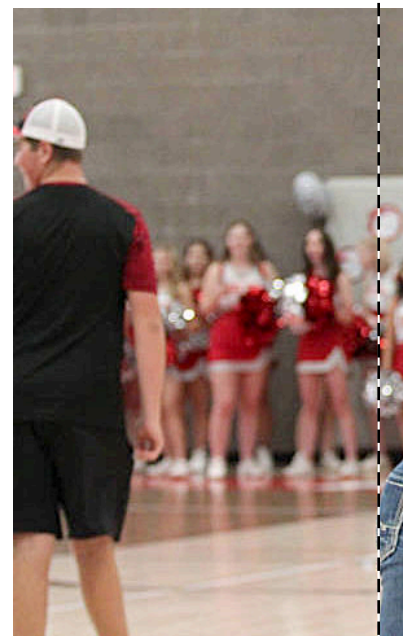
