 - 1. Recommending Wild Apricot (or similar) membership platform
 - a. Would combine current sites (SNO, Wufoo, Stripe, Smore, and manual invoices) into one place
 - i. Would greatly reduce cross-referencing
 - ii. Would allow for year-round memberships (automatic)
 - iii. Includes event registration and check-in
 - iv. Includes mobile app

 - 6. Requirements: enthusiasm for student journalism, networking, physical presence at important events and meetings (Jess sent a document that they sent out in 2020) be more specific about attendance at events added to Jess's document per Patrick
 - 7. Post the salary range and responsibilities.

- ii. Discuss CU post tour and proposal. What are our thoughts?
 - 1. Deans will match the cost \$3,500
 - 2. Proposed dates: Tuesdays/September 10th is too early/Tuesday, October 1st or Thursday, October 3rd the best choice? Thursday may be difficult if there is a football game of State of the campus event.
 - 3. October 1st best choice
 - 4. Do we want to do a staggered approach? 2-year cycle and reevaluate? Wait until we have experienced CU for the first time. There may be logistical issues at CU. Go though a 2-year cycle and then evaluate during the fall meeting. Give it two years.
 - 5. Boulder will be getting an event center/hotel in two years a ballroom that can host in a few years. CU Event Center that can host much larger numbers.
 - 6. Kristy email more central, connections/professionals, up for a Tuesday change, more time between sessions?
 - 7. Later release due to the movement around campus? Getting from Mackey to UMC might be the biggest issue an extra half hour in the schedule.
 - 8. This is a great opportunity to expose our students to a variety of schools.

- elevators available - sizes of rooms vary -


Various sized Rooms in Case 👍
